Lucas Waldin



LUCAS WALDIN is a dynamic and versatile conductor whose performances have delighted audiences across North America. He has collaborated with some of today's most exciting artists including Carly Rae Jepsen, The Barenaked Ladies, Crash Test Dummies, Ben Folds, The Canadian Brass, and Buffy Sainte-Marie, in addition to conducting presentations such as Disney in Concert, Blue Planet Live, Cirque de la Symphony, and the groundbreaking symphonic debut of R&B duo Dvsn as part of the global Red Bull Music Festival.

Waldin has been a guest conductor for numerous orchestras in the U.S. and Canada, including the Cleveland Orchestra, the St. Louis Symphony, the Houston Symphony, the Dallas Symphony, the Grant Park Festival Orchestra, the Vancouver Symphony, the Calgary Philharmonic, the Toronto Symphony, and the National Arts Centre Orchestra.

Having joined the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra as Resident Conductor

in 2009, Waldin was subsequently appointed Artist-in-Residence and Community Ambassador - the first position of its kind in North America. He appeared with the ESO over 150 times and conducted in Carnegie Hall during the orchestra's participation in the 2012 Spring for Music festival. In recognition of his accomplishments he was awarded the Jean-Marie Beaudet Award in Orchestral Conducting and received a Citation Award from the City of Edmonton for outstanding achievements in arts and culture.

A native of Toronto, Ontario, Waldin holds degrees in fl ute and conducting from the Cleveland Institute of Music.

UBC Symphony Orchestra

The UBC Symphony Orchestra (UBCSO), directed by Dr. Jonathan Girard is one of the leading post-secondary orchestras in Canada. It presents six regular concerts each academic year at the world-class Chan Centre for the Performing Arts and gives special performances both on and off campus. It provides musicians in training with the opportunity to learn, rehearse, and perform a diverse classical repertoire and gain professional-level experience while earning course credit toward undergraduate and graduate degrees.

The UBCSO has made four commercial recordings in the last ten years, two of which have been Juno-nominated. With an annual choral-orchestral concert, student concerto competition,



composer readings, and numerous special interdisciplinary projects, the UBCSO is a vibrant community of dedicated musicians.

Juliana Loh

Juliana Loh is a XR Designer and an immersive artist who translates concepts and stories through Google Tiltbrush paintings. Her work as a VR innovator has been called unique, beautiful, awe-inspiring and representative of this time and age. Drawn to global perspectives, Juliana identifi es with the sto-rytellers, visionaries, healers and game changers in a world in need of hope, vision and positive transformation. She explores imagination in ways that cel-ebrate 'humanity' in an uncertain world.



Juliana draws from more than a decade of brand entertainment and design experiences and has spoken on the world stage at various AR/VR global events including SXSW. Juliana's stunning tiltbrush metaverse worlds which she created with developer Nicholas Liang garnered global attention first in 2019-2020 with the introduction of "JingleVille" (altspacevr) and then in 2021 when their award-winning metaverse follow-up called "Awaken the Giants" was recognized at Burning Man VR 2021 as well as subsequent international film festivals including (VIFF) Vancouver International Film Festival, (HIFF) Hawaiian Film Festival and QLD XR Festival in Queensland, Australia. Juliana has served as a cultural advisor for XR projects and was honored this year to have participated as a juror at this year's Siggraph 2022 panel. She is very grateful for the chance to share her talents at the Chan Centre for Performing Arts and hopes to inspire others, especially members of diversity and inclusion to discover their own creative spark through XR emerging artforms.

Risa Tonita

A vibrant musician, Risa Tonita performs as a solo and collaborative pianist, and as a singer. She especially enjoys working on music that features extended techniques such as playing on the strings and pins inside the instrument, using her physical voice to tell a story while playing the piano, and adding items to the strings to create a prepared piano. Upcoming collaborative projects in-clude a UBC Noon-Hour recital of music for bassoon and piano by Chihchun Chi-sun Lee in collaboration with bassoonist Ingrid Chiang (March 15, 2023).



Risa's experience in theatre, dance, and singing, as well as her commitment to fighting stigmas associated with mental health, gender inequity, and cultural

oppression have inspired her Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) research. She is currently studying feminist theories and political philosophy that support the development of the "self" as a way to connect more deeply with her audiences.

Risa graduated with a Bachelor of Music and a Master of Music in piano per-formance from the University of Ottawa under the guidance of Frédéric Lacroix and holds a "Diplôme d'études musicales" from a conservatory in France. She is currently working on a DMA degree at UBC and is thoroughly enjoying being on this adventure with her supervisors, Dr. Corey Hamm and Dr. Hedy Law. When she needs a break from her piano shenanigans, Risa loves to sing, dance, bake, eat delicious food, and spend time with family, friends, her husband Alexander, and her mini-Aussie Luna.

Anthony Knight

Antony Knight is a Vancouver based composer, singer and actor. He is a recent graduate from the UBC School of Music where he obtained his BMUS in opera performance and composition. Growing up, Antony was heavily involved in the music and theatre scene in his hometown of Kelowna, British Colombia. As an avid multidisciplinary performer, Antony's area of music composition focuses on the intersect between music and story. Recent works include; the score for Uncharted Waters (documentary) by Molly Dennis, music for The Triumph of Love (play) with Western Gold Theatre, music for PSSST...! (devised theatre piece) with UBCO Theatre, Blank Spots (for 6 voices) commissioned by the Belkin Art Gallery for the Nadia Lichtig exhibit, and Oh Alfred! (Opera in 2 Acts) commissioned by the Vernon Proms Classical Music Festival. He has also written several concert works, notably The Protector of the Okanagan (for orchestra) which was performed by both the



the Vancouver and Victoria Symphony Orchestras at their composer reading sessions. He was also awarded Best Score at the 2019 Persistence of Vision Film Festival for The Knockers.
