Mamachimowin

Mamachimowin (the act of singing praises) is a choral work that explores the difficult relationship between Indigenous spirituality and the impact of the Christian culture on First Nations people. Translating Psalm 67 into Cree, I wanted to add a musical perspective that added a dimension of fragmentation into the structure of the work. Also, I wanted to utilize the instrumentation of violas, cellos, and double basses to give the idea of the strings representing a foundation of the ground, or Mother Earth. I wanted to present the idea of musical tension and musical phrases along with the choir whispering some of the text to add an element of uncertainty. (Andrew Balfour)

PERSONNEL



Graeme Langager is Director of Choral Activities at the University of British Columbia School of Music. As is a passionate and dynamic conductor, Langager is sought-after as a clinician, adjudicator, educator and guest conductor. He has performed throughout Europe and across North America, appearing in such venues as St. Mark's in Venice, St. Peter's in the Vatican, St. Steven's in Vienna, Carnegie Hall in New York and in cathedrals and concert halls in Spain, Italy, France, Austria and the Czech Republic. Langager's choirs have also performed at numerous choral conferences, including: NCCO (National Collegiate Choral Organization), ACDA-AR (American Choral Directors Association Conference, Arkansas), IAJE (International Association of Jazz Educators), MENC/NAfME (National Association for Music Education), and the Montreux and North Sea Jazz Festivals. Langager served as the artistic director and conductor of the acclaimed Phoenix Chamber Choir in Vancouver from 2012-2018, during which the choir released 3 CDs, performed with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, Andrea Bocelli, and was privileged to be invited to perform at Canada's Podium Conference in 2016 showcasing the best choirs in the country.

Langager was born into a musical family, singing and playing instruments from an early age. He received the doctoral degree in choral conducting from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, and the master of music degree from California State University, Long Beach. Langager also holds a degree in Jazz Studies. He has taught for more than 20 years in universities and colleges in the United States and Canada, and is also active as a composer and arranger.



Hyejung Jun serves as Assistant Professor of Choral Conducting at the University of British Columbia after completing her Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. She earned her Master of Music degrees from Yonsei University in Korea and Emory University in the United States.

During her time in Cincinnati, Jun conducted and assisted the CCM Chamber Choir, the CCM Chorale and taught undergraduate conducting classes. She also was awarded the May Festival Conducting Fellowship for the 2018-2019 season under the mentorship of Robert Porco, Director of Choruses of the May Festival Chorus. Additionally, she has served as Assistant Conductor of the Women's Chorus at Xavier University.

Jun has extensive experience as a singer, pianist, and conductor. Her performances have been recognized for their sensitivity and excellence. Prior to coming to the United States, she was the winner of the National Choral Conducting Competition in Seoul, South Korea, and after moving to the United States, she was a finalist in the Graduate Conducting Competition of the American Choral Directors Association.



Will de Sousa (he/him) is in his first year of the Master's of Choral Conducting program at UBC, having previously earned his Bachelor's degrees from both UBC's School of Education, and School of Music. Outside of the program, Will is the director of the Coastal Sound Youth Choir, where he strives to provide his singers with opportunities to grow as artists and individuals, and gain a sense of belonging through involvement in a caring community. For the past six years Will has also taught in the Burnaby School District as both a choir and band director, primarily at Alpha Secondary School.



Britney Huynh (she/her) is a conductor, performer, and educator with a background in both instrumental and choral conducting. She completed her BMus and BEd at the University of Alberta while singing in ensembles like the Madrigal Singers, Opera Workshop, Chorale Saint-Jean, and Pop Goes the Opera. In addition to performing, Britney has been an active member of the music education community in Edmonton since 2016 - teaching K-12, and assistant conducting the Edmonton All-City Choir. This is Britney's second year in the MMus program in Choral Conducting; she is thrilled to be a part of such an incredible group of choral conductors and to be studying with Dr. Jun and Dr. Langager.



An emerging choral conductor originally from Regina, Saskatchewan, **Will Ireton** (he/him) first trained as a pianist, earning his ARCT in Piano Performance. Before moving to Vancouver, Will worked with choral ensembles at First Presbyterian Church while completing his undergraduate studies in music at the University of Regina. Will is currently pursuing studies in Choral Conducting at UBC (MMus. '23) under the direction of Dr. Langager, and is thrilled to be working with Oriana, UBC's Treble Chorus.



Man Li (he/him) is a first-year choral conducting Master student at the University of British Columbia under the tutelage of Dr. Graeme Langager. He was taught choral conducting by Vivian Ip and Felix Yeung. He was the conductor of Cantus12, Aqua Voice, KMYLS Junior Choir, Yuen Long Lutheran Secondary School's Show Choir and Yuen Long Children's Choir. His choral works have been performed by Aqua Voice, Yuen Long Children's Choir, Tidal Men Chorus, and St. Joseph's College Chamber Boys' Choir (in Taipei International Choral Festival). One of his choral works has also been chosen to premiere in the Bauhinia Concert 2021.



Hanwen Liang (he/him), a Chinese lyric baritone, is doing his first-year master's degree of Choral Conducting at UBC. After being granted his first bachelor's degree of pharmacy by Shanghai University of Traditional Chinese Medicine, he immigrated to Canada with his family. Before that, he had won several awards, including three first prizes of National Art Student Competition. In addition, he served as assistant conductor of University Chorus in Shanghai University of T.C.M. In 2018, he was enrolled into the School of Music at the UBC and began studying with Dale Throness. In 2022, he got his second bachelor's degree of music, major in Opera Performance.



Zachary Manlapid (he/they) is a conductor, music director, singer, and violist from San Diego, California. He grew up playing in orchestras before discovering singing in high school. He attended Palomar College, graduating with an AA in Sociology and later transferred to UC Berkeley, earning a BA in Music while discovering conducting. Upon graduation, he worked as the Assistant Conductor to the UC Berkeley Chamber Chorus and Music Director at the College Light Opera Company in Cape Cod. He's currently a second year MMus Choral Conducting student where he co-conducts the treble chorus Oriana along with Will Ireton



Michael Stahl (he/him) is a seasoned performer, conductor, and teacher. He spent his childhood singing with Grammy-award winning Ragazzi Boys Chorus in the San Francisco Bay Area, and has since sung with (and directed) their alumni ensemble, Ragazzi Continuo. He is known for his theatrical performances, including Candide (Candide), Pirates of Penzance (Frederic), and Rent (Mark). He currently sings tenor with the Vancouver Chamber Choir. Michael is proud to be studying with Dr. Graeme Langager at the University of British Columbia, where he eagerly explores the world of choral music with his colleagues, students, and fellow singers.
