"Besides having music in my blood, I heard music night and day," says Orquesta Buena Vista Social Club's Eliades Ochoa. It's a statement that surely rings true for many other artists who will visit the Chan Centre for the Performing Arts this year-artists who embrace their family names and long musical lineages while daring to move beyond them.

As I curated this series, I began to see these connections across generations. Senegal's Youssou N'Dour is a singer who tackles relevant, contemporary issues in a way that unmistakably harks back to his griot heritage of sung history and social commentary; Anoushka Shankar continues to blaze beyond her father's path of modernizing the sitar; and celebrated Portuguese singer Carminho, having been soaked in the fado music of her famous mother, now brings her own expressive voice and emotions to audiences worldwide. I invite you to experience the assemblage of their music, talent, brilliance, and conviction, as they continue to redefine these legacies on the Chan Centre stage.

Speaking of legacies, in 2015/16 the University of British Columbia marks 100 years since both its first intake of students and its first graduating class. In this centennial year celebrating students and alumni, I hope you will take in some of the wonderful programming by talented student ensembles from the UBC School of Music, as well as the many vibrant events and exhibits that take place throughout the Arts and Culture District here on campus.

Fellow Co-Managing Director Cameron McGill and I are excited to embark on another year of performances that will create lasting legacies of their own. We look forward to welcoming you.

Orquesta Buena Vista Social Club®

Orquesta Buena Vista Social Club[®] is the beloved Cuban phenomenon that was born of the GRAMMY Award winning *Buena Vista Social Club*[™] recording and subsequent Wim Wenders documentary film. After touring the world and thrilling audiences for 16 years, they now bid the global stage farewell with the Adiós Tour.

When American guitarist Ry Cooder along with Nick Gold and Juan de Marco recruited a group of aging Cuban musicians for a recording project in Havana, no one could have predicted the group's rapid evolution into a multi-generational big band whose members would serve as bona fide musical ambassadors for their country. Don't miss your last chance to see the legendary ensemble credited by *Rolling Stone* for triggering "a worldwide Latin-jazz revival," including incomparable vocalist **Omara Portuondo**, vocalist and tresero **Eliades Ochoa**, trumpeter **Guajiro Miraba**l, laúd virtuoso **Barbarito Torres**, and bandleader and trombonist **Jesús "Aguaje" Ramos**. *This concert is not part of any subscription package*. *Subscribers can purchase tickets in advance of the general public, see page 14*.

Paco Peña

"If you only ever see flamenco once in your life, make it this!" says London's *Independent on Sunday*. **Paco Peña** is a true master of his craft, widely considered to be the greatest flamenco guitarist in the world. His notable career started almost six decades ago in Andalusia, Spain. Since then, he has brought the treasured art form to millions of people around the world with authenticity and innovation through his recordings, concerts, teaching, dance company, and productions.

Hailed as "a virtuoso capable of dazzling an audience beyond the frets of mortal[s]" by *The New York Times*, Peña's latest show "Flamencura" brings together a distinguished ensemble of guitarists, singers and dancers in a passionate, primal, and fiery tribute to both the rich history and thriving future of flamenco music and dance.

Youssou N'Dour

TUE NOV 10 2015 / 8pm

Youssou N'Dour has been called "the African voice of the century" and "one of the world's greatest singers." A native of Senegal, N'Dour draws on his griot heritage of sung history and social commentary to make music of exceptional power and relevance.

His voice has launched social movements, rallied international support for Africa, and called for women's rights and religious tolerance. An icon of the post-colonial movement to Africanize popular music, he blended traditional sounds of Senegal with influences from around the world to create the rhythmically captivating genre, *mbalax*, and has since continued to explore new territory with his music. His work as UNICEF ambassador and Senegal Minister of Tourism and Culture has made him the ultimate global musician.

Joined by his long-time band Le Super Étoile de Dakar, this electrifying artist returns to Vancouver for the first time in over 25 years to perform his greatest hits.

Carminho and Sara Tavares

Celebrate the diversity of Portuguese/Lusophone music with this double bill of two very different artists who share both a homeland and a culture. Spirited singer-songwriter and guitarist Sara Tavares opens the show with funky rhythms, warm Portuguese vocals, and gorgeous, textured songwriting. Born in Lisbon to Cape Verdean parents, she represents the new generation of singers who celebrate their heritage but incorporate global influences.

The evening shifts to a fado mood in the second half with **Carminho**. Born Carmo Rebelo de Andrade to a mother who is also a revered fado singer, her distinctive sound draws inspiration from fado legends Lucília do Carmo, Fernando Maurício, and Amália Rodrigues, alongside other popular forms of music. She is one of the most outstanding and heartfelt voices to come out of the recent fado resurgence.

Branford Marsalis

Branford Marsalis' jazz roots run deep. This acclaimed saxophonist is the eldest brother in the illustrious New Orleans jazz family that includes patriarch Ellis and siblings Wynton, Delfeayo, and Jason. But the three-time GRAMMY Award winner and NEA Jazz Master is not content to rest on his heritage. Following stints in the legendary Clark Terry's band, Art Blakey's Jazz Messengers, and brother Wynton's groundbreaking quintet, he formed his own quartet which quickly became the standard against which other ensembles are measured.

His quartet recently released Four MFs Playin' Tunes, an album praised as "a knockout: hard-nosed and hyperacute, tradition-minded but modern" (*The New York Times*). For this Vancouver debut, Marsalis will be joined by a group of critically lauded musicians for an evening that mixes jazz standards with original works.

Dee Dee Bridgewater and Irvin Mayfield with the New Orleans Jazz Orchestra

Extraordinary vocalist Dee Dee Bridgewater collaborates with jazz trumpeter and bandleader Irvin Mayfield and the New Orleans Jazz Orchestra on "Dee Dee's Feathers," a modern and compelling vision of New Orleans portrayed through its rich musical traditions. Time-honoured songs and new compositions weave a slice of the city's history in a rich concert experience that will have you feeling as if you're hanging out on the front porch of "Dee Dee's Feathered House," a cottage in the Tremé neighbourhood.

Over the course of a career spanning four decades, GRAMMY and Tony Award winning singer Dee Dee Bridgewater has ascended to the upper echelon of vocalists, putting her unique spin on standards and jazz classics. Irvin Mayfield is the founding artistic director of the GRAMMY Award winning New Orleans Jazz Orchestra, established to celebrate and advance the historical legacy of New Orleans jazz.

Anoushka Shankar

With her own fresh spirit and style, sitar player Anoushka Shankar is blazing new branches of the trail established by her late father, Pandit Ravi Shankar. Surrounded by musicians of the highest calibre since childhood, she absorbed many styles and techniques to create her own special brand of global music rooted in Indian classical teachings. Lately, she has toured with the British band Jethro Tull; collaborated with composer Philip Glass and Anglo-Indian producer/musician Nitin Sawhney; recorded with Sting and Norah Jones (her half-sister); and been produced by the Indian-American electronica innovator Karsh Kale.

For this Chan Centre appearance in support of her highly anticipated new album, the impeccably gifted sitar player will be joined by **Sanjeev Shankar** on shehnai and tanpura, **Manu Delago** on percussion and hang, and a DJ.

Arlo Guthrie

Fifty years ago, beloved folk performer **Arlo Guthrie** took out the trash after a Thanksgiving dinner that couldn't be beat. This hilarious account of actual events that precluded him from military service in 1966, became both a platinum-selling record and a full-length motion picture.

Arlo, who carries on the musical legacy of his late father Woody Guthrie, only performs the complete "Alice's Restaurant Massacree" on its 10-year anniversaries because of its length (about 18 minutes). The Alice's Restaurant 50th Anniversary Tour will feature the full massacree, along with many other favourites from the prolific songwriter's catalogue. Following this appearance, it is likely the iconic work will again be removed from the menu. "I'll do it again for the 60th anniversary, or I'll be dead. Whichever comes first," says Arlo.

Cécile McLorin Salvant

Back by popular demand! **Cécile McLorin Salvant's** appearance at the Chan Centre last season left the crowd longing for more. Her exceptional vocal power, soul, and virtuosity are breathtakingly showcased through her one-of-a-kind interpretations of jazz standards and rare blues compositions. This hotly anticipated follow-up performance is in support of a brand new album.

Cécile McLorin Salvant was launched onto the international stage after winning the 2010 Thelonious Monk Jazz Competition at just 21. Her pitch-perfect phrasing and beautiful delivery amazed the judges, and she's been wowing audiences worldwide ever since. The critics agree: in 2014, her debut album *WomanChild* earned a GRAMMY nomination for Best Jazz Vocal Album and she swept the DownBeat International Critics Poll, winning in four categories. One thing is for certain – this remarkable, imaginative talent is here to stay.

Blackbird, Fly

A concert for voice, body, and strings. FRI SEPT **25** 2015 / **7:30**pm

"Spacious skies merely mock the blackbird with crippled wing. We slice the blackbird's throat and ask her why she does not sing..."

Blackbird, Fly weaves a tapestry of movement, narrative, music, Haitian folklore, and hip hop into an intimate duet between two preeminent sons of Haitian immigrants: composer/violinist Daniel Bernard Roumain (DBR)-described by The New York Times as "about as omnivorous as a contemporary artist gets"-and venerable arts activist/spoken word artist Marc Bamuthi Joseph. Through stories of their lives and personal experiences, Blackbird, Fly is introspective yet uplifting, heightening our collective consciousness and shedding new light on the arts as a powerful tool for social engagement. The Beyond Words series at the Telus Studio Theatre is presented by the Chan Centre for the Performing Arts and explores the power of words in performance, both as an agent of change, and as a means of igniting conversation.



Words in Motion

What happens when words come to life? Three writers and three choreographers work in pairs to create new works combining the cerebral and the physical. Choreographer **Olivia C. Davies** explores narrative through movement, using contemporary Aboriginal dance theatre as her launch point; **Anusha Fernando's** training in classical Indian Bharata Natyam dance reflects a tradition steeped in storytelling; and **Paraskevas Terezakis's** long history of interdisciplinary collaboration has incorporated a vast array of styles and methods. With their writing partners, these diverse artists bring three very different visions to the marriage of words and movement.
