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Chan Centre Presents Concludes Season with Sansei: The Storyteller

Vancouver, BC — The Chan Centre for the Performing Arts at the University of British Columbia presents *Sansei: The Storyteller* on April 28 at the Telus Studio Theatre, supported by Presenting Sponsor RBC. The acclaimed one-man-show, created by and starring Kunji Mark Ikeda, traces his family's history from feudal Japan to Japanese-Canadian internment during WWII to the present day. Produced by Cloudsway Dance Theatre, *Sansei* has sold out shows across the country. The hit show received four stars from the Calgary Herald which praised Ikeda as a "master storyteller," while the Calgary Fringe Festival named it the Best of the Fest in 2015.

Weaving together dance, narrative, historical audio and family recollections, Ikeda centres much of the show on the treatment that his family and some 22,000 other Japanese descendants endured when the Canadian government declared them enemy aliens after the bombing of Pearl Harbor. Ikeda connects a direct line between the othering and persecution that Japanese-Canadians faced then with the discrimination faced by people of colour today.

"What happened to Japanese-Canadians during internment and beyond is one of the darkest moments in Canada's recent history," says Kunji Mark Ikeda. "But the way I tell the story doesn't focus on blame or shame. I aim to contextualize in ways that we can accept and build together, through story, through joy, through connection. A line of the work is particularly resonant: 'if we're really lucky, no one else will have to know what forced relocation feels like... Let's remember this feeling.'"

Despite the heavy subject matter, Ikeda tells his story with grace, compassion, and unexpected humour. Forgiveness and reclamation are at the heart of his story as he captivates audiences with hardly anything more than his voice and the effortless movements of his body.
